The Army Force Management School continuously educates and trains Army leaders, Soldiers, and Civilians worldwide in force management principles, enabling them to execute the Secretary of the Army's Title 10 responsibilities.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-week Manpower and Force Management Course (MFMC) prepares military (02 - 04 • W01 - W04 • E6 - E8), civilian personnel (GS-07 - GS-13), and designated contract man-year equivalent (CME) personnel with little or no experience in Army Manpower and Force Management to serve as manpower and force management analysts. MFMC underscores the dynamics of current force structure initiatives, both in the Operating and Generating Forces and their impact on Army Commands, Army Service Component Commands, and Direct Reporting Units. The course introduces the skills required to analyze, validate, and document Army force structure by placing a strong emphasis on practical exercises, application tools, and the importance of requirements determination. At the completion of the course, students can assist mid-level management within the Manpower and Force Management functional areas.

The two-week MFMC provides a collaborative learning environment with small groups, guest speakers, and a guest panel. Students take part in small groups for collaborative work such as Practical Exercises and a Case Study, which enhance the learning experience.
